Background:

FORUM Connemara is a rural development partnership of voluntary, community and statutory bodies based in Connemara. Established to address local disadvantage, FORUM Connemara has been working for the past thirty-four years to empower groups and individuals in the project area. All its programs adhere to the principles of community development.

The Dúlra Natura Communities Programme

FORUM Connemara works with the LIFE IP Wild Atlantic Nature (WAN) and others in this community-led project which aims to extend the current rhododendron control programme within the Mweelrea/Sheeffry/Erriff Complex SAC to the greater SAC and to targeted areas within the Connemara Bog Complex SAC and the Twelve Bens and Garraun Complex SAC. It also seeks to expand local capacity to implement other peatland restoration actions such as fencing, access, drain management and conifer removal.

Job Description

FORUM Connemara seeks to recruit Dúlra Field Operative for Invasive Species Control and Bog Restoration who will work as part of the project team.

Responsibilities:

- Conduct daily outdoor operations primarily focused on controlling rhododendron using chainsaws and herbicide application. (Utilise NPWS preferred method of stem injection for rhododendron control.)
- Perform tasks related to the control of other invasive species as required.
- Participate in bog restoration projects, including water table management, fencing and related tasks such as making biochar and wool prototype products.
- Adhere to safety protocols and regulations while operating equipment and handling







chemicals.

- Maintain accurate records of work activities and report any issues or observations to supervisors promptly.
- Work collaboratively with team members to achieve project objectives efficiently and effectively.
