As part of this work, FORUM Connemara wishes to recruit a supervisor to oversee the panel of FIELD OPERATIVES to treat Rhododendron on selected lands.

The supervisor will treat rhododendron but also oversee the team so that the work is carried out in an effective and efficient way. The supervisor will:

- Liaise with landowners to schedule the work
- Develop a rota for the farms/areas for treatment
- Collect timesheets from operatives
- Organise PPE gear for the operatives
